

Thursday 19 September 2013 LACOCK ABBEY AND VILLAGE. WILTSHIRE

We have re-considered a visit to this National Trust house and picturesque village. Although the journey is a little longer than usual (2½ hours), we think you will agree it is worth an early start (see panel at bottom of previous page).

The Abbey, founded in 1232, was converted into an atmospheric country house in 1540, leaving many features, such as the cloisters, intact. It was the home of William Henry Fox Talbot. whose pioneering photographic work can be seen in the museum. You may find that you recognise the charming village, which dates from the 13th century, since it is often used in TV periods dramas such as Cranford. Cost: £15 for NT members. Nonmembers will be asked to pay an entrance fee at the door. Note special departure times (see opposite).

Monday 14 October 2013 **BLETCHLEY PARK**

FULLY BOOKED - WAITING LIST

We have all heard of Bletchley Park, the historic site of the secret code-breaking activities during the Second World War. Above all, we know something of the dramatic discovery of the solution to the Enigma Code, which was so instrumental in our winning the war.

The Days Out Committee has arranged for you to see the machines that the code-breakers used, and also to see one of the very first computers- it is huge!

There is approximately one mile to walk on the guided tour, but wheelchairs are available.

We have all seen the new state-of-theart news studio on our televisions; here is the chance to see it in the flesh! The BBC now transmits their multimedia programmes from the newly redesigned and updated centre at Langham Place.

The tour promises to be both eniovable and informative, with the opportunity to see some of the studios whilst learning about the history of the BBC. If you would like to experience what it is like to read the news and weather forecast, you can do this too (though not live!).

A fair amount of walking is involved, but there is a café on site for rest and refreshment.

Friday 17 January 2014 THE CHEAPSIDE HOARD and THE MUSEUM OF LONDON

The Cheapside Hoard is a new exhibition at the Museum of London of a priceless collection of 16th and 17th century jewels, which were found under the cellar floor of a house in Cheapside. The reason why they were hidden and never reclaimed is a mystery.

The exhibition will present fascinating insights into Elizabethan and Jacobean London.

There is a café at the museum and plenty of other displays to interest you before we head home.
