Tuesday 13 May 2014: MORE HISTORIC CHURCHES OF ROMNEY MARSH

By popular request, we have arranged a visit to see a further selection of these little medieval churches. Each idyllic church is unique, and our guide is an enthusiastic and informative member of the trust set up to preserve them. Stout shoes are recommended as there is a little country walking and maybe a few steps to negotiate.

Wednesday 16 July 2014 **BUCKLER'S HARD, HAMPSHIRE**

Situated on the banks of the River Beaulieu, Buckler's Hard is now a peaceful hamlet where private sailing boats lie at anchor. However, in the 18th century it was a busy and important shipbuilding centre. There is a small maritime museum and reconstructed 18th-century cottage interiors, including a shipwright's cottage, in the village street.

There are pleasant woodland walks and, to complete the day, a short river cruise with commentary. Café and restaurant.

Monday 28 April 2014 HUGHENDEN MANOR

This was the Buckinghamshire home of Benjamin Disraeli. The rooms are filled with his books, paintings and furniture.

Hughenden was the mapmakers' secret HQ during WW2. The house is set on a steep hill, but it is worth the climb to be able to go round this atmospheric and historic building.

After lunch we will make a short journey to a garden centre close to the notorious Hellfire Caves. You will then be free to wander around the garden centre, or to go into the caves (extra cost; wear sturdy shoes).

Tuesday 17 June 2014: WHITE MILL AND SALUTATION GARDENS, SANDWICH

The White Mill Heritage Centre is a fully restored and functioning smock windmill built in 1760 for **grinding** corn. We will have coffee there and look around before going on to the Salutation Gardens.

The 3½ acres of gardens were designed by Lutyens in 1911, and Jekyll is said to have overseen the planting — so we are in for a treat. The locals call them the secret gardens because they have only recently been reclaimed from their semi-wild state. The gardens should be at their best at this time of year and, weather permitting, you could sit outside admiring the view while you have lunch.

A short walk will take you into Sandwich, where you can have a meal if you prefer.

We will not want to be rushed, so we must make an early start again with just two pick-up points (see panel opposite).
