You are sure to find this a fascinating place. It was started in the early 14th century and is a hotchpotch of styles and gables added on to the original structure as the inhabitants of the time built upwards and outwards as their needs arose.

The mote is tucked away in a thickly wooded valley. You come upon it quite suddenly and can readily believe the story that Cromwell's men missed it and went on to loot somewhere else in their rampage through Kent.

The interior is every bit as interesting as the outside promises with its Great Hall, the crypt and the Grade 1-listed dog kennel!

Try to keep some time to wander in the lovely grounds and admire the views across the Kent countryside.

There is a café where you can buy your lunch if you haven't brought a picnic.

The Chelsea Pensioners are a familiar sight in and around London wearing their distinctive scarlet uniform which, as I am sure you know, only men were entitled to wear until recently.

Their home, the Royal Hospital, designed by Sir Christopher Wren, is beautiful and imposing; it lies on the bank of the Thames at Chelsea, a peaceful oasis in the heart of London, except, of course, for a few weeks every spring when the Chelsea Flower Show is held in the grounds and it is not peaceful at all.

One of the pensioners will show us round to see, among other delights, the magnificent chapel and dining hall. There is an interesting little museum, and a café in the Margaret Thatcher wing, where we shall have reserved tables for 12 noon to make sure you can sit down, but the meal is not included in the cost.

If you still have time on your hands after lunch, there is the National Army Museum next door to the hospital which is also well worth a visit.

Thursday 25 September **THE GREAT GATSBY** **Northern Ballet**



Nick Carraway comes to know his infamous neighbour Jay Gatsby – a mysterious millionaire with a secret past and a penchant for lavish parties and beautiful women. Wednesday 8 October **TO KILL A MOCKINGBIRD**



Harper Lee's Pulitzer Prize-winning novel is one of the most enduring and best-loved stories of our time. Written as an urgent plea for tolerance and compassion at the height of the Civil Rights movement, it tells the story of Scout Finch as she grows up during the 1930s depression in the small town of Maycomb, Alabama. Her childhood innocence is shattered when her father, Atticus Finch, defends a young black man

accused of rape.

The stage production brings out a universal tale of prejudice and deep inequalities but, eventually, humanity. It is directed by Max Webster, who was based at the Royal Exchange on the Regional Theatre Young Director's Scheme in 2011, where he directed *My Young and Foolish Heart*.

Wednesday 5 November **CALAMITY JANE**

Following numerous highly acclaimed productions that include *Sweeney Todd* and *Sunset Boulevard*, the Watermill Theatre returns with a new production of the classic musical *Calamity Jane*. Starring Jodie Prenger (*Oliver!*, *Spamalot* and *One Man, Two Guvnors*) alongside a cast of multi-talented actor/musicians, this brand new production gets to the heart and soul of the musical.
