Wednesday 21 January 2015 IMPFRIAL WAR MUSFUM



The Imperial War Museum consists of a group of several museums in various parts of the country. We shall be visiting the museum in London concerned with modern conflicts in which British and Commonwealth soldiers took part from WW1 to Afghanistan and the present day.

In the WW1 galleries, you can follow the course of the war and see how it affected both those at the front and their families at home. A similar display showing WW2 enables us to compare the conditions and appreciate the advance in technology achieved in the intervening time.

This museum has recently undergone refurbishment so we can expect the exhibits to be displayed in a clear and imaginative way. We may find that, as we are able to take a more informed worldwide view of recent events, we will be able to have an improved understanding of their causes and outcomes.

DENNIS SEVERS' HOUSE

If you visit this house, you will experience what life was really like for the poor inhabitants of London in the 18th century. The artist Dennis Severs bought an unmodernised silk weaver's house and kitted it up to seem as if the Jarvis family are still living there. It is recommended that you go round in silence. The atmosphere is electric: fresh flowers on the table, newspapers left lying about, and the breakfast things not yet cleared away. You can smell the toast in the kitchen and you may catch yourself listening for sounds of the family in the next room.

If you venture up to the attic, you will find that an even poorer family lives there.

This is a private house, so there is no café or shop, but there are plenty of cafés near by.

You may also find the Baroque Huguenot Christ Church and the Spitalfields street market worth visiting.

This should be an interesting and busy day.

Friday 27 March 2015 THE JEWISH MUSEUM

This museum's wide range of exhibits should prove stimulating and thought-provoking as it covers the long, rich and varied history of Judaism. We have booked a short introductory talk lasting 10-15 minutes on arrival.

Among the exhibits are oral records, Jewish art, photographs, Jewish weddings and religious articles. The history of the Jewish people from the Middle Ages to 1940 in other countries is also on display.



There is a pleasant dairy kosher café where you can have your lunch. Then, if you have time to spare, a short walk will take you to Camden Lock market or Cecil Sharp House, which holds the Vaughan Williams Memorial Library with its many rare and unique items, both printed and in manuscript. Or you can wander into Regent's Park.
