

Friday 27 March 2015 THE JEWISH MUSEUM

This museum's wide range of exhibits should prove stimulating and thoughtprovoking as it covers the long, rich and varied history of Judaism. We have booked a short introductory talk lasting 10-15 minutes on arrival.

Among the exhibits are oral records, Jewish art, photographs, Jewish



weddings and religious articles. The history of the Jewish people from the Middle Ages to 1940 in other countries is also on display.

There is a pleasant dairy kosher café where you can have your lunch. Then, if you have time to spare, a short walk will take you to Camden Lock market or Cecil Sharp House, which holds the Vaughan Williams Memorial Library with its many rare and unique items, both printed and in manuscript. Or you can wander into Regent's Park.

Tuesday 21 April KEW GARDENS

Spring at Kew! What could be more inviting? You'll see the famous outdoor display of dazzling spring plants and flowers. When you have had your fill of these delights there is George III and Queen Charlotte's small palace to



see; and last but not least, you can visit the gallery of paintings by Marianne North. She was a Victorian lady who travelled alone all over the world painting landscapes and botanical subjects. These are housed permanently in a separate building, where you will be amazed at the sheer quantity of her lovely paintings.

The Temperate House and the Evolution House are closed for restoration, but everything else, including the Palm House (pictured), should be open.

We have organised a train ride to take you round the site which, although flat, is extensive. The palace, gallery and train ride are included in the price, but you must either bring a picnic or get something to eat at a restaurant in the gardens.

Tuesday 26 May WHITSTABLE

Whitstable today is a charming old fishing village, beloved of yachtsmen and artists, where you can poke about to your heart's content. It is criss-crossed by a warren of little alleyways and short-cuts down to the bustling harbour with its fascinating sail lofts, shipyards and colourful fishing boats.



Not all Whitstable is old-world, however. In 2005 an award-winning regeneration of a run-down quarter of the town was undertaken and new shops, houses and an art gallery were built.

Whitstable has been known ever since Roman times for its oysters and, indeed, there are several restaurants and inns where you can sample them for your lunch; or you might prefer some other lovely fresh fish or seafood straight off the boats.

With such a variety of aspects, everyone should find something here to interest them.

Tuesday 9 June UPTON GREY, HAMPSHIRE

You could be forgiven for not having heard of Upton Grey; this pretty little village is one of the best-kept secrets of the district.

The main attraction is the magnificent garden of the Manor House, which will be at its best in June. Thirty years ago, the present owners inherited the bare bones of a Gertrude Jekyll-designed garden, but it was completely overgrown



and unrecognisable as such. They have done careful research and have lovingly completely restored the garden, so now it is the most authentic Gertrude Jekylldesigned garden - anywhere!

Of course you will want to take your time to wander round this really stunning garden where we are booked in during the afternoon, but do try to make time while you are there to pop into the medieval church, perhaps go for a walk and saunter through the village to admire the many listed buildings.
